HOW TO RIDE

PAYING FOR YOUR FARE

- Bus fareboxes and Trolley ticket vending machines accept coins and bills
- Credit/debit is only accepted at Trolley ticket vending machines
- No change is available on buses
- Day passes allow transfers from buses to Trolleys and unlimited rides
- Up to two children age 5 and under may ride free with a paying passenger
- One-way Trolley tickets are good for two hours from time of purchase

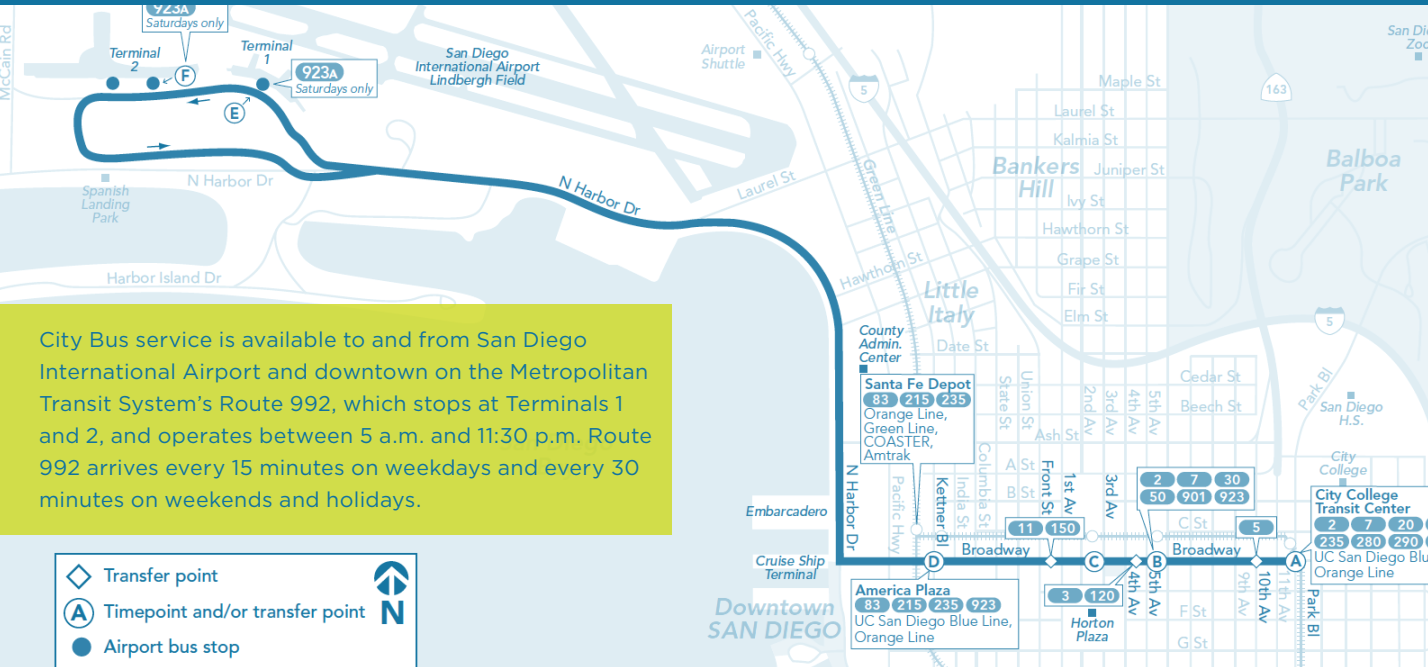
PASS PRICES

There is a \$2 fee for a Compass Card, which can be reloaded and will last up to five years. Compass Cards are available for purchase at ticket vending machines located within each terminal's baggage claim.

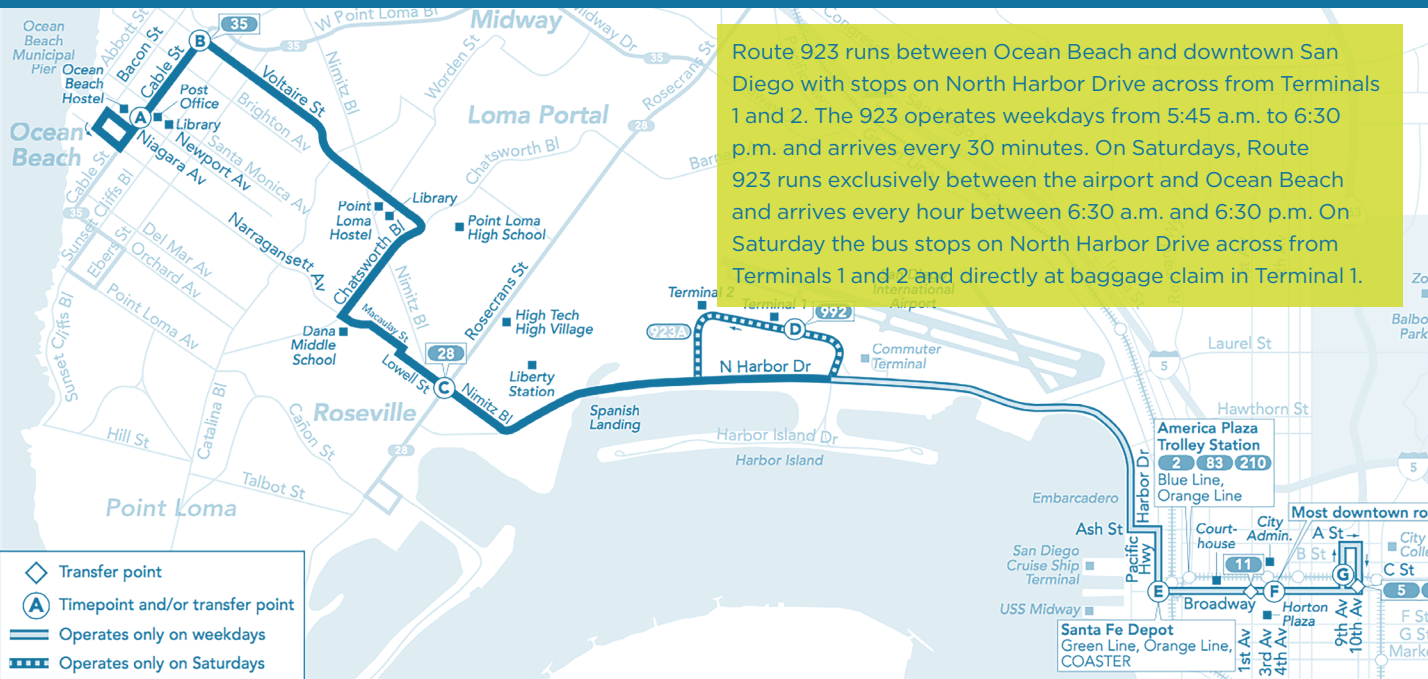

MTS TROLLEY

The MTS San Diego Trolley has three lines that serve many popular areas and attractions in San Diego, including downtown, the convention center, SDSU, Old Town and the Mexican border. There are two ways to reach the Trolley from Terminals 1 and 2.

CITY BUS

All three Trolley lines can be reached by taking City Bus Route 992 to the Broadway and Kettner Blvd bus stop in downtown.

Once off the bus, the Orange and Blue Lines can be accessed from the America Plaza Station on the corner of Broadway and Kettner Blvd. The Green Line can be accessed from the Santa Fe Depot Station on Kettner Blvd, one block north of the bus stop.

SHUTTLE SERVICE TROLLEY→TERMINAL

Passengers can also access the Green Line by taking the Trolley to Terminal shuttle service. The service is available from the transit islands at Terminals 1 and 2. The shuttle drops passengers off on the north end of the airport, just one block from the Middletown Station.

AMTRAK/COASTER

Amtrak Intercity and COASTER commuter trains link communities and travelers from as far away as Los Angeles and Orange Counties to downtown San Diego and coastal North County. The trains include stops in Old Town, Sorrento Valley, Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad and Oceanside.



Travelers headed to and from the airport can connect with Amtrak's Pacific Surfliner and the COASTER at the Santa Fe Depot Station in downtown by taking City Bus Route 992 from either Terminal 1 or 2 to the Broadway and Kettner Blvd stop. Once off the bus, the Santa Fe Depot Station is one block north on Kettner Blvd.

Amtrak operates seven days a week, 365 days per year, with twelve round trips. Tickets are available at Santa Fe Depot, Old Town, Solana Beach and Oceanside.

The COASTER operates daily, with the exceptions of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. Tickets are available at all train and Trolley stations.
