Policy for Public Participation in Board, Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC), and Committee Meetings (Public Comment)

- 1) Persons wishing to address the Board, ALUC, and Committees shall submit a "Request to Speak" form prior to the initiation of the portion of the agenda containing the item to be addressed (e.g., Public Comment and General Items). Failure to submit a form shall not preclude testimony, if permission to address the Board is granted by the Chair.
- 2) The Public Comment Section at the beginning of the agenda is reserved for persons wishing to address the Board, ALUC, and Committees on any matter for which another opportunity to speak is not provided on the Agenda, and on matters that are within the jurisdiction of the Board.
- 3) Persons wishing to speak on specific items listed on the agenda will be afforded an opportunity to speak during the presentation of individual items. Persons wishing to speak on specific items should reserve their comments until the specific item is taken up by the Board, ALUC and Committees.
- 4) If many persons have indicated a desire to address the Board, ALUC and Committees on the same issue, then the Chair may suggest that these persons consolidate their respective testimonies. Testimony by members of the public on any item shall be limited to three (3) minutes per individual speaker and five (5) minutes for applicants, groups and referring jurisdictions.
- 5) Pursuant to Authority Policy 1.33 (8), recognized groups must register with the Authority Clerk prior to the meeting.
- 6) After a public hearing or the public comment portion of the meeting has been closed, no person shall address the Board, ALUC, and Committees without first obtaining permission to do so.

















411001: NT1 Airside Improvements Active Project Phasing Limits



411001: NT1 AIRSIDE IMPROVEMENTS PHASE 6.1A - INFILTRATION BASIN CONSTRUCTION









Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program

- Applies to recipients of Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds of \$250K+ awarded prime contracts
- Includes New Terminal 1, Airside, Capital Improvement Projects, Quieter Home Program



Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) Program

- Applies to recipients of Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding from FAA
- A concession may be a business located at an airport engaged in the sale of goods and/or services to the public or a business that provides goods and services to those businesses
- Includes Food & Beverage, Retail, Passenger Services, Car Rental Companies, Vendors to Car Rental Companies



Program Updates

- Federal regulations updated May 1, 2024
- Highlights:
 - Additional data collection on all firms competing for contracting opportunities
 - DBE Bidders List
 - ACDBE Active Participant List
 - Strengthens monitoring & prompt payment requirements
 - Raises the PNW cap (last adjusted in 2011)
 - Expedites & simplifies Interstate Certification Process



Program Updates

- Small Business Elements
 - Replicates the DBE program's small business element requirements for the ACDBE program
 - Goal is to increase small business opportunities, not only AC/DBE businesses
 - New small business certification
 - No geographic, race or gender preferences
 - Requires airports to submit annual reports on their small business elements



Small Business Element

- Reserve opportunities for "Small Business Only"
- Require outreach by prime contractors for subcontracting opportunities
- Unbundle large projects to "right size" subcontracting opportunities
- Targeted and Earlier Outreach



2023 ESG Report Highlights

- Direct ("Prime") Contract Engagement
- Contracts derived from all formal solicitations awarded to contractors in 2023.
- The Authority tracks 10 different business types within direct contract engagement, and reports progress on these solicitations to the Authority Board.

Major Construction Project Spend (2023)

- The Administration Building
 - \$76 million in subcontracting opportunities;
 - \$21 million was paid to small businesses.
- Arrive NT1
 - \$23 million paid to Small Businesses,
 - \$280 million to local businesses
 - \$3 million to Service-disabled/Veteran-owned Small Businesses (SDVSB).



Local Business Enterprise Program

- 10 Contract Awards
 - Total Contract Value \$81 million
 - \$32 million to LBEs
 - \$28 million to SBEs



Quieter Home Program

- Six QHP construction projects awarded in 2023
 - \$1,405,288 was awarded to SBE and
 - \$638,837 was awarded to DBE.
